VII. Items from Board Members

Mr. Acebedo commended the staff on Wasco High's and Independence High's graduations. They were both well organized.

Mr. Wallace agreed the graduations were great. People were impressed with the graduates walking through the staff and giving "high fives" to them.

Mr. Fulwyler dittoed the comments on graduation. He had heard comments that this was the best one at Wasco High.

Mr. Holtermann said a community member had asked him if the football stadium could be left open for the community to use the track.

Mrs. McCray stated the district is working that out. It is open in the mornings at approximately 6:30 a.m. for the community to walk the track. When school is in session, the public would need to leave when school starts. We are working on leaving it open during the evenings.

VIII. Reports

Mr. Holtermann presented Valerie Gomez with a plaque in appreciation of her two years of service as Student Board Representative.

Valerie introduced Jessica Sidhu who will be the Student Board Representative for the 2008-09 school year. Jessica reported the Link Crew would have their first meeting next weekend.

Mr. Holtermann reporting for NKVTC stated the construction house still has not sold.

Mrs. McCray agreed with the Board members on the high school graduation. It turned out to be a beautiful evening for the ceremony. She stated we were successful (66% yes voted and 34% no votes) for our bond. The election results should be certified tomorrow. She will be going to San Francisco with Mr. Lonza in July to do a rating presentation.

Mr. Lonza gave a construction update on the projects. He had drawings of the proposed physical education sports complex, the proposed cafeteria and the proposed Master Plan. The classrooms for Phase III are complete and ready to be moved to the high school site, but there is an issue with the transportation of the modulars. Mrs. McCray has contacted some of the local politicians to receive their assistance in helping get this matter resolved. The impact fees from the City of Wasco is going to be approximately \$99,000 for Phase

III. Phase II is being held up because of the Preliminary Environmental Assessment on the sports complex. The crosswalk issue has been resolved at this time with the two crosswalks across Palm Avenue having in-pavement amber lighting for oncoming traffic. They will have speed bumps and raised truncated domes warning of the crossing. The crosswalks will be activated by students as they enter the street. The pricing for the wrought iron fencing of different heights with or without pilasters around the sports complex were discussed along with the required brick fencing behind the fire station and medical building.

Mr. Isom congratulated the Board on the successful passage of the bond and thanked the district for trusting the bond program to their company. He stated it would be approximately a three month process to sell the bonds. The Board will need to approve a resolution in July providing the authority to sell bonds based on the assessed value of the district. Since it was a Prop 39 election there will be mandatory performance and financial audits. An independent oversight committee will have to be appointed. The Board will have sixty days to seat a committee after the election results have been certified. The committee will consist of seven community members. The rating presentation will take place in early July and the bonds will then be priced. The district's money should be deposited around the end of August.
